Please note: Ages listed for a character may refer to the character's age in the script or the performer age range and serve as guidelines only. The director may adjust them as required by the production. Performers of all ages and genders are encouraged to audition.

Mary Poppins

Music by Richard M. Sherman & Robert B. Sherman, Book by Julian Fellowes

One of the most popular Disney movies of all time has captured hearts in a whole new way: as a practically perfect musical! Based on the books by P.L. Travers and the classic Walt Disney film, *Disney and Cameron Mackintosh's Mary Poppins* delighted Broadway audiences for over 2,500 performances and received nominations for nine Olivier and seven Tony Awards, including Best Musical.

The cast will consist of approximately 14 men, 12 women and two children. Ages listed below are guidelines for the age of the character.

Cast of Characters

Bert The narrator of the story, is a good friend to Mary Poppins - hurdy-gurdy player, sidewalk artist and chimney sweep. He has charm, speaks with a Cockney accent and is a song-and-dance man. Male, 30 - high baritone

George Banks The father to Jane and Michael Banks - a banker to the very fiber of his being. Demanding "precision and order" in his household. His emotional armor conceals a sensitive soul. Male, 40-60 - baritone

Winnifred Banks George's wife and Jane and Michael's mother. A former actress, she is a loving and distracted homemaker – trying to be a model wife and mother, to live up to her husband's expectations. She has great warmth and simplicity. Female, 30s - mezzo

Jane The high-spirited daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Banks - bright and precocious but can be willful - inclined to snobbishness. Female, 11 - soprano

Michael The cute and cheeky son of Mr. and Mrs. Banks. Excitable and naughty - adores his father and tries to be like him. Male, 9 - soprano

Katie Nanna Jane and Michael's nanny at the beginning of the show.
Overwhelmed and upset - has had her fill of the Banks children. Female, 30s

Policeman A neighborhood fixture who is respected by and observant of households on his beat. Male, 30s

Miss Lark The haughty next-door neighbour of the Banks family who treats her dog, Willoughby, as if it was her child. Female, 30s

Admiral Boom A retired Royal Navy man and neighbour of the Banks with a loud and booming voice - has a soft spot for his neighbour, Miss Lark. Male, 50s - baritone

Miss Brill The housekeeper and cook for the Banks family. Overworked and harassed - always complaining that the house is under-staffed. Intimidating exterior - warmth underneath. Female, 50s – mezzo

Robertson Ay The houseboy to the Banks family. Lazy, sleepy and grumbling, he never gets things right and believes himself to be useless. Male, 20 – tenor

Mary Poppins Jane and Michael Banks's new nanny. She is extraordinary and strange - sometimes a little frightening. She is practically perfect in every way and always means what she says. Female, 20s - mezzo with strong top notes

Park Keeper Uniformed and officious, he makes sure no one breaks park regulations - secretly hankers after his childhood. Male, 40

Neleus The statue of a young boy posed with a dolphin in the park. A small and lonely being, he is very happy to befriend Jane and Michael. Male, 16 - dancer

Bank Chairman The head of the bank where Mr. Banks is employed - an Edwardian stuffed-shirt. Male, 50 – 60 – baritone

Miss Smythe The Bank Chairman's humourless secretary. Female, 40s

Mrs. Corry Exotic. Owns magical gingerbread shop. Female, 40s

Bird Woman Covered with patchwork of old shawls, gruff, folksy Female, 50s – mezzo

Miss Andrew George's scary nanny, a bully. Female, 40s – soprano with alto belt

John Northbrook Honest businessman seeking a loan Male, 30s

Von Hussler A businessman seeking a loan from the bank for a shady business deal.

Ensemble Annie, Fannie, Valentine, Teddy Bear, Mr. Punch, Doll, Chimney Sweeps, Toys, Parkgoers.

Six Dance Lessons in Six Weeks by Richard Alfieri

Lily, an aging but formidable retiree, hires Michael, an acerbic dance instructor, to give her dance lessons in her condo in St. Petersburg Beach, Florida. Antagonism between a gay man and the wife of a Southern Baptist minister gives way to profound compatibility as they swing dance, tango, foxtrot, and cha-cha while sharing barbs and intimacies along with the dance steps.

Lily Harrison a lovely, well-dressed woman – 70s

Michael Minetti a dance instructor – 35 - 50

It's the day after the funeral of a friend, and three women gather for a round of golf in honour of their recently deceased playing partner. They are joined by a fourth woman, another friend of the deceased that the other three didn't know about. During the round the women discuss life, love, men, sex, children, careers...everything but golf. Many surprises, secrets and confessions come to the surface during this hilarious and heart-warming round.

Cast of Characters

Margot	50 – 55	Business woman, no nonsense, mother figure to her friends, drinks a bit
Tate	early 40s	Sensitive, stay at home mom, wants more from life now that her children are independent
Connie	50 – 55	Narcissistic, promiscuous, tough, resilient, says what she thinks
Dory	early 40s	Kind, smart, mother to six, always wanted to be a singer

Early Stages

Our Apprenticeship Theatre Program

Early Stages is an apprenticeship theatre program for young performers aged 10 to 14. Participants will take classes with Artistic Producer Scot Denton and instructors who are students in college performance Programs or graduates. Classes will include voice and text, improvisation, acting and movement and will take place at St George's Anglican Church in Haliburton during the month of July. Classes will begin July 2 and run during the daytime Monday to Thursday (excluding July 1) for four weeks. There will be a presentation of work created at a suitable venue late in July. Participants may work in separate junior and senior groups and also together. The cost is \$215. There are a couple of bursaries available for Early Stages – please speak to Sean Pennylegion (contact info below) if you would like more information about them.

If you are interested in Early Stages, please plan to visit us during the auditions on the weekend of January 26/27 at the Northern Lights Performing Arts Pavilion, which is located at the High School in Haliburton. Applicants auditioning for Early Stages should bring indoor shoes and comfortable clothing and expect to take part in a short theatre-related game or exercise. Dance experience and singing are not prerequisites.

Audition Requirements

Print the last page of this package (page 8) – the Audition Information Sheet – fill it in and bring it to your audition. Dress comfortably and bring indoor shoes.

Those who are new to the Festival should be prepared to either perform a short monologue (maximum 2 minutes) or tell a short story. You may be asked to read “sides” (a short scene) – this may extend your audition time. If you wish to audition for the musical (and are new to us), we will need to hear you sing. You should bring sheet music, so we can provide piano accompaniment. Please don't prepare something from *Mary Poppins*. If you have questions about singing at your audition, please contact us.

You are encouraged to be familiar with the plays and the musical. *Mary Poppins*, *Six Dance Lessons in Six Weeks* and *The Ladies Foursome* may be viewed in e-copy. Please note - The casting process takes time and is a critical part of each production – it may be several weeks before it is finalized.

Rehearsal Schedule

It is our expectation that a minimum of 100 hours of rehearsal time for each production will have been achieved prior to performance (120 hours for *Mary Poppins*). The weekly rehearsal schedule will be established by the directors and the cast. However, each production has rehearsals each week on Saturday and Sunday during the day, (and possibly the occasional brief rehearsal early Friday evening), beginning at the end of April or some time in May, depending on the date of the production's opening. Actors cast in ensemble roles in the musical will not be required at every rehearsal.

Please note: The Festival moves into the theatre towards the end of June. During the ten days to two weeks prior to each production's opening (see dates below), rehearsals will be more frequent, and will likely require everyone in attendance.
